SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS

The regular curriculum of the district's schools is designed to accomplish the district's educational goals and objectives for a thorough and efficient system of education for all pupils.

When necessary, the regular curriculum and/or the student's program shall be altered, modified, supplemented or other means used to provide for the identified needs of the following pupils:

- A. The classifiable educationally disabled
- B. The gifted and talented
- C. Those requiring compensatory or remedial programs
- D. The disaffected and alienated
- E. Pregnant pupils
- F. Pupils requiring home instruction
- G. The physically disabled
- H. Those with limited English proficiency
- I. The disruptive
- J. Students with a disability covered by Section 504 plan
