N.J. OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS LAW

REPORT OF THE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE: Sean Sullivan

Mr. Sullivan reported that the students are preparing for midterm/final exams, which will have a significant impact on grades.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION: (7:35 – 8:50 P.M.) Alfred Annunziata – New Jersey School Boards Association, presented the Annual Ethics Training and the Review of the 2014 Board Self Evaluation.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT:

Mr. Novosielski reviewed the 2015 committee assignments and contact list.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT:

Mr. Hurley reported on the following:

- He will be working on a preliminary schedule of Board committee meetings for the coming year, and will report to the Board at the February meeting. He expects that committee meetings will typically be scheduled for the evening of the second Monday of each month, with some exceptions.
- He has provided instructions to all Board members on forwarding messages from the district's email service to personal accounts and urged all Board members to check their district email frequently.
- He has provided a copy of the Bergen County Election Calendar to all Board members.
- With regard to preparations for PARCC testing and research into blended curriculum, he reported that both are well underway and the Board can expect a report on these initiatives at a Board meeting in April or May. A public forum on PARCC testing will be held on January 14.
- With regard to a possible middle school reconfiguration, preliminary research indicates that a reconfiguration could provide substantial benefits to middle school-age students, and asked for a consensus from the Board to support further research. With no objections raised by the Board, he reported that research will continue and the Board can expect a final report from the committee at a Board meeting in March or April.
- With regard to the possible implementation of a preschool program, he noted that there may be some cost savings to be realized, but that

additional study, including the need for busing, still needs to be completed. He will ask Mr. Killian to provide a detailed report at a February Board meeting.

- Due to low student participation, he is recommending that the district discontinue its Latin program in 2015/2016.
- He has provided a copy of the October 30, 2014 letter from Commissioner Hespe, in which it is stated that parents and students may not opt out of PARCC testing.
