Read Across America Day, March 4th: Lincoln School celebrates the anniversary of Read Across America on March 4th. We will be having special guests to celebrate books and read aloud. In the past, special guests have included Town Council members, Chief Russo, Superintendent Hurley, Ms. Jane from the Rutherford Public Library and Board of Education members. The RHS Future Teachers of America will be visiting this week, as well. The RHS students read to the students and have them participate in activities related to the reading.

School Appropriate Attire: Although fashionable now, the following types of clothing are inappropriate for school. (See Rutherford - Student Dress Code: Policy 5511 Dress and Grooming (pgs 20 of the Rutherford Public Schools Pre-K through Grade 3 Student & Parent Handbook):

- 1. Extremely low cut, transparent clothes, **bare midriffs**, revealing undergarments.
- 2. Dresses, skirts or shorts that are shorter than mid-thigh; spandex shorts are not acceptable except in gym class.
- 3. Hats, headbands, bandannas and sunglasses unless for medical or religious reasons (documentation may be requested).
- 4. Clothing, patches, or symbols which contain profane, obscene, offensive, and inappropriate language, references to alcohol, sex, tobacco or drugs; or demeaning references to specific gender, nationality, ethnicity, race, or religion.
- 5. Outdoor jackets or coats except when entering or leaving the building.
- 6. Footwear that is considered unsafe or dangerous.

March Vocabulary: We continue our school initiative to build our students' vocabulary. This improves comprehension and writing. Each week, each grade level will have exposure to four words throughout the day. Specialists, homeroom teachers, custodians, lunch aides and office staff will infuse these words in daily conversations. We know children need to hear a word multiple times before he/she can understand the meaning in text and use the new word in writing and speaking. Parents are encouraged to use these words also to complement our efforts. Below is the list of March words for each grade level:


