ACADEMICS

Academic Decathlon - Mr. Jason Narozny

Academic Decathlon is a competition team that begins in June and meets periodically in the summer and continually through March. A different thematic topic of study is pre-chosen by a national committee each year. The topic covers various subjects including science, economics, history, art, music, literature, and math. Most importantly, every level of student is accepted, from a perfect 4.0 GPA to students with a 'C or below' average. We compete against schools across the state as well as nationally. Individual awards and scholarships can be won at the competitions.

National Honor Society - Ms. Debra DeLia & Mrs. Kelly Lancaster

The Rutherford High School National Honor Society is an organization that encompasses the best all around students at Rutherford High School. To be eligible the students must meet the selection criteria evaluated by a faculty council. The selection criterion is based on a system that evaluates a student's performance according to scholarship, character, leadership, and community service. The students must have at least a 3.7 GPA from freshman year through the second quarter of their junior year.

CAREERS

Fashion Club - Mrs. Jessica Ferlauto

The Fashion Club promotes the power of style, creativity and charity work. This club provides a place to express artistic freedom with opportunities to grow, develop and express themselves through a mutual love for fashion.

FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America) - Ms. Cherryl Bott-Melfa & Mrs. Judy Leonard

FBLA is an international non-profit organization whose motto is Progress, Service, Education. The Rutherford chapter of FBLA strives to follow this motto by participating in community service projects, school service projects, and competing at the regional, state, and national levels with students from schools across the nation. These competitions include all areas of the business world, from interviewing skills to computer science. The club meets regularly and operates the school store.

FCCLA Club (Family, Career & Community Leaders of America) - Ms. Geraldine Howard & Mr. Mark Bergen

FCCLA promotes personal growth and leadership development through Family and Consumer Sciences education, focusing on the multiple roles of family members, wage earners, and community leaders to develop skills you will use throughout life. Community service is a large part of the organization. They participate yearly in the national FCCLA sponsored service projects. Past projects have included working for *The Ronald McDonald House Foundation, Amalda's Crossing, and Feed the Children*.

Future Teachers of America - Mrs. Margaret Nastasi

The club helps students explore teaching as a career choice, provide a realistic understanding of teaching, and encourage students from diverse backgrounds to think seriously about the teaching profession. Students are active in the *Teacher Outreach\Mentor Program, Read Across America, and Shadow a Teacher Day*.

The club promotes activities and programs that encourage health education and foster a healthy lifestyle. Students are active in RHS's annual blood drive, AIDS awareness day and American Heart Association projects.

This club is a unique blend of drama, debate, and case law, which allows students to test their academic and theatrical skills. Team members meet to discuss case objectives, plan strategy, rehearse scenarios to compete in the New Jersey Mock Trial competition.. It is a chance to form close friendships, gain valuable experience in public speaking and test their skills during the competition at The Bergen County Court House.

COMMUNITY

Newcomers Club - Ms. Judy DePasquale

This club's goal is to make new students at RHS feel comfortable while learning the "ins and outs" of RHS. The best way to do this is to pair new students to RHS with a "buddy" who will show them around and make new friends in the process.

Amnesty International - Ms. Bonnie Donnell

Amnesty International is a club that supports the rights of children around the world. The club does community service activities that include letter writing to governments to stop hunger, making peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for school lunches for poor children and school supply drives for underprivileged school districts.

Gender Sexuality Awareness (Formerly The Gay/Straight Alliance) - Mr. Michael Stracco

Gay-Straight Alliances, or GSAs, are student-led and student-organized school clubs that aim to create a safe, welcoming, and accepting school environment for all youth, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity. The Gay-Straight Alliance at RHS works to educate the school community on matters of tolerance and diversity, to create alliances that increase awareness, decrease prejudices and to create a safe school atmosphere for all students.

E.R.A.S.E. (End Racism and Sexism Everywhere) - Ms. Judy DePasquale

E.R.A.S.E. is a club at RHS that helps students learn about diversity, equality and justice. It is made up of a group of students that acknowledge the fact that embracing equality and justice as core values are helping transform our world. Becoming tolerant is just not enough. They realize that they must come to see, analyze, and work against the structural and social practices that continually create and re-create a world of division namely, poverty, race and religion. Students come to understand diversity, equality, and justice through guest speakers, conferences, and service-learning project. A requirement of E.R.A.S.E. membership is to attend the monthly Civil Rights Commission meetings at Borough Hall.

Civil Rights - Ms. Judy DePasquale

As a member of the E.R.A.S.E. club at RHS students have the opportunity to become as sitting member of the Rutherford Civil Rights Commission for the school year. The goal of the E.R.A.S.E Club and Civil Rights Commission to eliminate discrimination and foster dignity, respect, understanding, and acceptance of all citizens by increasing public awareness of their civil rights. This is accomplished through the advocacy of education not only at the school level but also throughout the community.

Students who become members of the Civil Rights Commission provide conflict resolution and mediation for all civil rights complaints in the community.

They work with a local non-profit nursery in running activities for its students, and run a prom for the Senior Citizens in the town.

It also takes a leadership role in training Rutherford student leaders of today as the adult leaders of tomorrow. Student Council raises money each year for The Student Council State Charity through various fundraisers that take place each month. Student Council also runs The Homecoming Dance, Homecoming Parade, and Spirit Week. To become part of Student Council, you have to be elected. Elections take place every May. FINE ARTS

Art Club - Ms. Stephanie Castellano

The Photography Club is open to all and there is no prerequisite to join, although having some photo experience will make the club that much more rewarding. Students meet twice a month after school to work on the projects.

LANGUAGE

World Language Honor Society - Ms. Bonnie Donnell & Ms. Jianna Muscio

The World Language Honor Society is by selection only. Students who receive a grade of 90 or higher and a B overall in all classes are inducted into the French & Spanish National Honor Societies. Students in both honor societies must maintain a B average in order to remain an active member. The FHS provides tutoring for the lower levels of French and for fellow classmates. The SHS has a Teacher Assistant Program where students come to the classroom and assist the teacher during their free time. They also do community service such as participating in the Michael Cassidy Shamrock 5K, and collect donations for underprivileged girls.

French Club - Ms. Bonnie Donnell

The French Club does many activities including a French Spelling Bee, verb tense relay races, club colors days, and Flyswatter tournaments. The club also does several community service drives including baked goods for a soup kitchen, canned goods for the Rutherford Food Pantry and a clothing drive for fire victims. Finally, the club does field trips to restaurants and shows around the New York City area. We also host the annual French Soirée, which is a night of French food, culture, awards and usually has over 200 attendees.

Spanish Club - Ms. Nicole Clark

Spanish Club members meet once a month to enhance their cultural awareness through current event discussions and charity work. The Spanish club participates in many fundraisers and community service throughout the year. They collect food items which are donated to the Rutherford Food Pantry and participate in a toy drive for the Tomorrow's Children's Foundation through the HUMC. Students also take a yearly field trip to the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island.

LITERARY

The Book Club meets monthly in a relaxed atmosphere to discuss books of their choosing. Past selections include both classic and contemporary novels. The students enjoy both the camaraderie and the chance to develop deeper and develop critical and analytical skills by discussing a book that they have enjoyed reading. The R-Hi is the high school's newspaper. The newspaper prints quarterly and seeks to inform faculty, staff, and students about school events, athletics, academics, interests, and ideas. The newspaper aims to provide a well-rounded reporting, writing, editing, and layout experience for students interested in a future in journalism. Students from grades 9-12 are encouraged to join during the first half of the academic year.

SCRIBE - Mrs. Melissa Dougard

SCRIBE is the school's literary magazine that is comprised of student-generated poems, stories, essays, photographs, and sketches. It is published once a year (in the spring). All students are welcome to submit to SCRIBE. We are currently in need of members to assist us in collecting literary and artwork. The yearbook chronicles each school year with special emphasis on the senior class and its academic, co-curricular, and social activities. Students are able to learn the latest techniques in photojournalism, copywriting, editing, and graphic design using an online digital program that gives them real life experience. Meetings frequent from September to April during lunch and after school. Students hold roles such as editor, photographer, page designer, and various organizational and creative positions. MATH AND SCIENCE

Biology Club - Ms. Jacqueline Kozek & Ms. Niki Ketikidis

The Biology Club is a community service oriented club. The goal of the club is to help the students develop an appreciation for how important plants and animals are to our environment. The students are taught how to care for and respect animals. The students create posters for Earth Day. The students run a food drive for a local animal shelter and volunteer to help plant and weed areas around town. The club is also involved with the GFWC Junior Woman's Club and their Ladybug Festival.

Chemistry Club - Mr. Mark Rojowski

The Chemistry Club is open to all students who have an interest in Chemistry. The Chemistry Club is an extra curricular activity in which students participate in a variety of activities and labs on topics in chemistry that are not necessarily covered in Chemistry 1 or AP Chemistry. On occasion the Chemistry Club will visit local colleges and universities that sponsor "Chemistry Day" programs.

The Girls in STEM club was formed to broaden and inspire female student understanding of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Students discuss the role of women in STEM, conduct activities, attend workshops, and plan events to promote STEM within the district.

Math Team - Ms. Deborah DeLia

The Rutherford High School Math Team is a member of the Bergen County Math League. A group of junior and senior students from Honors and AP classes compete with mathematics students from other schools in the county at six meets throughout the year. At each meet, students are given six questions, two at a time, with a 12-minute time period in which to solve each pair. Questions are scored individually and at the end of the year, top scoring students receive awards.

Psychology Club - Mrs. Jennifer Moloughney

This club engages in discussions and lessons related to current news in the field of psychology. Students from the AP Psychology class will be teaching information related to psychology in the real world to members of the Psychology Club. The club also fundraises for psychology-related disorders and collaborates with psychology clubs from different schools.

Physics and Engineering Club - Mr. Alex Robayo & Mr. Tim Ajala

The main goal of the physics and engineering club is to build a community with students who have an interest and/or plan to pursue careers in these fields. The club meetings involve activities and long-term projects that involve physics principles and the engineering design process.

The main goal of the Robotics Club is to introduce students to robotics and collaborate with other robotic clubs. The Robotics club meets monthly and meetings increase as events approach. PERFORMING ARTS

Drama Club - Mrs. Patricia Blanchard

The purpose of Drama Club is to engage in meaningful theatrical activities and productions, to acquire valuable life and 21st century skills, time management and social skills and to learn production and theater trade skills. The Drama Club also instills a fondness of production, stage, film and literature arts and inspire creativity within one's self by fostering their own personal talent and encouraging the talents in others. Students involved in the Drama Club assist and/ or participate in the fall dramatic production as well as the Spring Musical production.

Repertory – Mrs. Patricia Blanchard

Students with an interest in acting and/or all technical aspects of theatre are welcome to join a production night called Repertory. Repertory is a selection of student-directed and student-produced scenes that encompass theatrical pieces that are of interest to the students in old and new dramatic productions.

School Play & School Musical - Mrs. Patricia Blanchard

Auditions are usually held for the School Play during the first few weeks of school. The potential cast member must have a cursory knowledge of the show as well as what role he/she is interested in. The School Play usually begins rehearsals late September for a November performance. The School Musical is performed in the spring and auditions are usually held the week before the holiday break in December. Rehearsals begin in January gearing towards a March performance schedule. The potential cast member should be very familiar with the "score" of the musical as well as what role they are interested in.

Stage Crew - Ms. Jennifer Gagis

The purpose of the Stage Crew is to expose students to the world of theater technology and to provide hands on experience in all aspects of lightning, sound, and scenery. The Stage Crew is responsible for designing, creating and managing the sets for our school dramatic and musical productions.

Jazz/Brass Ensemble - Mr. Michael Faugno

Jazz is truly American music that reflects our culture and celebrates the trials and triumphs of all people. The club explores & performs various styles of jazz music while participating in the expansion of Jazz education.

Chamber Ensembles - Mr. Michael Faugno

Chamber Ensembles are small instrument specific groups that perform music written strictly for them. There are multiple groups with multiple combinations of instruments and experience levels. Audition is required for participation. Performances include Club Rutherford Small Ensemble Night and special appearances.

Pit Band - Mr. Michael Faugno

Provides live music for the RHS musical in the spring.

PopCert - Mrs. Patricia Blanchard

PopCert is Rutherford High School's annual rock and pop concert. It is an opportunity for students to perform their favorite songs or original material in a concert setting. PopCert is open to any student who plays a musical instrument, sings, raps, and/or dances. Students interested in light design; music technology, and stage crew are also welcome to participate. Auditions for PopCert are held in the spring, following the musical.

Vocal Ensemble (Special Chorus) - Mrs. Patricia Blanchard

Select Choir is an auditioned group. We meet once a week in the evening to rehearse music and prepare for performances. The Select Choir performs at various functions through**out the year. All students must be enrolled in Concert Choir in order to audition for Select Choir.**

Color Guard - Mrs. Jennifer Wise

Color Guard is the sport of the arts and provides the main visual component of our marching band field show. Their function is to add critical movement, drama and visual impact to the overall performance through the use of equipment work, choreography and dance. Rehearsals take place 2-3 times a week in the evenings during marching band season. Performances include football games, parades, band competitions, and special appearances. The RHS guard is open to all students regardless of previous experience.

Marching Band - Instructors - Mr. Michael Faugno, Mr. Joe Cavezza & Ms. Nicole Bowden

The RHS Bulldog Band is a dynamic ensemble of talented music students who have a desire to challenge themselves artistically as well as physically. The Marching Band performs an ever-evolving field production throughout the fall by competing in local marching band contests and weekly at home and away football games. In addition, the Marching Band leads all local parades and performs at special events in and around Rutherford.

SPORTS AND MIND
