- Physical Education
  - Classes meet two days per week
  - No locker rooms- student do not change for class
  - On Phys. Ed. days students must come to school dressed to participate and must wear sneakers. Slip on sneakers are not permitted
  - No jewelry is permitted in Phys. Ed.

- Art
  - Meets 1 time per week for the entire school year.
  - School wide art show will held in the spring. All students will have work on display.

- Library/Media Center
  - Meets 1 time per week for the entire school year.
  - Class topics include author and genre studies as well as research skills.
  - Media Specialist runs programs to promote reading such as Books and Beyond reading challenge, Read Across America Day events, and author visits

#### Music

- General Music classes meet one time per week for the entire year.
- Chorus is a co-curricular activity open to all students.
- Students practice after school, generally two days per week. There are two concerts per year one in the winter and one in the spring.
- Band is a co-curricular activity open to all students. The whole band practices during open period. Students receive 30 minute small group lesson instruction one time week during the school day.

#### Gifted and Talented

#### Cycle Classes

- Cycle classes will met daily for one marking period.
- Cycles classes include:

  - Integrated Arts (6<sup>th</sup> grade)

#### STEM- Grade 4

Students will explore a variety science concepts with a STEM focus in mind. The students will use problem solving skills to explore grade level next generation science standards. Students will explore concepts including waves, Earth's systems, Earth and Human Activity and Engineering Design skills. Students will be introduced to science practical skills, science lab report writing, and problem solving engineering design skills and applications.

## Digital Storytelling- Grade 4

This course will bring a student's imagination to life. Students will learn how to create short stop-motion movies, with a soundtrack to fit, using simple stop motion techniques, storyboards, cameras, and software. Working independently and collaboratively, students will use hands-on art and miscellaneous materials, 2D & 3D backgrounds, as well as themselves, to create visually unique and innovative characters, and scenes. Students will also be adding music to their creations, adding the element of timing, emotion, highlighting, intensity, mood, and tone, through sound.

#### Computer Applications- Gr 4

The fourth grade computer curriculum explores technology skills beyond basic levels of software applications and supports learning in both technology and regular curriculum topics. Areas of focus include proper keyboarding skills, online safety and digital citizenship, Internet research skills, introduction to coding, word processing, spreadsheets, drawing, and presentation software.

#### Spanish-Gr 4-6

- Spanish classes will be taught by Sra. Prettyman, a certified Spanish teacher.
- Students will utilize listening, speaking, and writing skills in the target language.
- The curriculum will evolve in subsequent years to cover additional topics and introduce more sophisticated grammar



#### Morning Routine

- Students will be supervised as of 7:50 a.m. Students will enter the building at 8:05 a.m.
- Each grade level has a designated line up area outside of the building.
- In the event of inclement weather students in grade 4 will assemble in the Multi-Purpose Room(MPR) and students in grades 5 and 6 will assemble in the gymnasium.
- The YMCA will be offering before and after care if you need to bring your child to school prior to 7:50 a.m.

### Lunch

- All students have a 42 minute lunch period daily. Half of the period is spent in the MPR eating, the other half is for recess.
- The lunch period for students in grades 5 and 6 is from 11:28-12:10.
- The lunch period for students in grade 4 is from 12:12-12:54.
- Forgotten lunches can be dropped off at the school until 11:00. There is a covered bin near the front steps for the lunches. The custodial staff will bring the bin in every day at 11:00.
- There is a "peanut free" lunch area. Students who must eat in the peanut free area are permitted to invite a friend or two to eat with them (space permitting.)

### Recess

- Each grade level has their own lunchtime recess.
- We make attempts to go outdoor for recess as often as possible.
- Students can participate in organized basketball, whiffle ball, or soccer games. The school provides equipment for these activities.
- There is also an area for tag games.
- Jump ropes and hula hoops are also available at recess.
- On inclement weather days, recess is held in the gymnasium.

## Dismissal

- Beginning in 4<sup>th</sup> grade students are dismissed on their own at 2:55 p.m. Teachers no longer "hand off" to a parent or designated adult.
- Students exit the building through the assigned grade level doors. \*Bus students exit through back doors regardless of grade level.
- The Computer Lab is open for students Tuesday-Friday until 3:45.
- The Media Center is open for students Monday-Friday until 3:45.
- Homework Club runs Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday until 3:45.



- The Parent Portal provides real time access to student grades 24-7.


## Power School

- Every Parent & Student (Beginning in Grade 4) will have an account to access grades & academic progress via Online & Power School Mobile in September 2017.
- Access All of Your Children Under "One Account" with single sign-on convenience. *Currently- Grades 4 to 12.*
- Power School replaces all hard copy progress reports and quarterly report cards. Power School operates in REAL TIME.
- Parents must create an account with the required <u>Individualized Access ID/ Access Password</u> that will be mailed home.
- Parents will receive a "Black Board-Connect 5" Automated Phone Call to check their child's grades each marking period. We have 4 marking periods at Pierrepont, this format continues up to 12<sup>th</sup> grade in Rutherford.
- Power School Parent Account Settings enable the parent to receive Daily, Weekly & Monthly E-mail Alerts to notify on Grades, Attendance and Detailed Assignments.
- Power School Mobile (iPhone & Android) offers Push Notifications on Grades & Attendance sent directly to your smart phone, tablet and even Apple Watch. *App must remain in "Logged-In Status"*.

# Technology

- The district will have a fully implemented 1:1 technology initiative starting with the 2017-2018 school year.
- All students will have access to Chromebooks.
- Students in grades 4 and 5 will access to a Chromebook throughout the school day.
- Students in grade 6 will be given access to a Chromebook that can be taken home.
- Pierrepont also has a computer lab of Mac desktops and Macbook laptops.
- We have subscriptions to several online learning platforms including: Learning A-Z, iXL, and NewsELA.

# School Supplies

# Transportation

- Courtesy/Subscription busing will be offered for the 2017-2018 school year at the cost of \$400 per child.
- The district will run a maximum of two buses.
- A bus will leave Pierrepont School at 7:30 a.m. and arrive to Union at approximately 7:40 a.m. The bus going to Pierrepont will leave Union at 7:45 a.m. and arrive to Pierrepont by 7:55 a.m.
- The District office has sent information about courtesy/subscription busing out to families. Busing will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.
