Dear Seniors and Parents:

The enclosed end of year schedule should be helpful as you plan for the busy weeks ahead. Some seniors may have conflicts due to colleges requiring attendance on campus for testing or orientation. We can usually resolve these conflicts and cooperate with you, but we <u>must</u> have a copy of the letter from the college showing the dates. Please consult the calendar on our website for dates and times of end of the year events.

Seniors are expected to be in attendance through Tuesday, June 20. It is absolutely essential that all seniors who intend to participate in the graduation ceremony be in attendance at rehearsals. Please do not request early dismissals for jobs, vacations, travel, college appointment, etc. Generally speaking, seniors will be dismissed at noon on rehearsal days.

Parents are invited to attend the Senior Awards Breakfast at The Fiesta in Wood-Ridge on Friday, June 2. Doors open at 8:00 a.m.; breakfast is served at 8:30 a.m. Seniors are invited free of charge but must pick up their tickets in the main office between May 22 and May 24 if they plan to attend the Awards Breakfast. Parent tickets are \$15.00 each and may be obtained when the student picks up his/her ticket. There are a limited number of tickets for parents. They are sold on a "first come, first served" basis.

The graduation ceremony will be held at Tryon Field on June 20 at 6:30 pm. Each graduating senior will receive eight tickets. If there is inclement weather, the ceremony will be held in the Washington School gymnasium and tickets will be limited to TWO per student. We have a dignified program planned for our seniors but wish to remind everyone that participation is a privilege. It is possible that some seniors, by virtue of previous unacceptable behavior in school or school-sponsored activities, or by being ineligible due to demerits, will be denied participation in the graduation ceremony. Individual seniors suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol prior to the start of the ceremony, or who exhibit unacceptable behavior, will be barred from the ceremony. By Board of Education Policy, only students who meet all requirements for graduation are permitted to participate in the ceremony.

The alcohol/drug policy will be enforced at the prom, which will be held on June 2 at the Royal Manor, Garfield, New Jersey from 7:00 pm - 12:00 am. We urge parents not to serve alcohol at prom or graduation parties and to see that alcohol is not consumed in rented limos on the way to the prom site.

Dear Students, Parents, and Guardians:

We have a very fair but firm attendance policy which places students in noncredit when they accrue more than eighteen (18) absences. It is vital that students be in school. Part of the policy allows for extenuating circumstances which require a student to arrive late or leave early on occasion. To accommodate these circumstances a student who arrives no later than 9:30 am and leaves no earlier than 1:30 pm is given credit for a full day of attendance and three academic blocks to be counted present for a half day of school.

Please be advised that the procedure for early dismissal will be strictly enforced with no exceptions. The regulations which follow may also be found in the *Handbook:*

The Board recognizes that from time to time compelling circumstances will require that a pupil be late to school or dismissed before the end of the school day.

As agent responsible for the education of the children of the district, the board shall require that the school be notified in advance of such absences by written request of the pupil's parent/guardian, which shall state the reason for the tardiness or early dismissal. Justifiable reasons may include:

- A. Illnesses which manifested themselves after the student reported to school;
- B. Medical or dental appointments which cannot be scheduled outside school hours;

- C. Driver's tests with verification of appointments;
- D. Emergencies sanctioned at the Principal's direction; and
- E. Interview for college entrance or employment.

Please note that illnesses will be verified by the nurse. A student under the age of 18 will only be released to a parent or guardian.

Dear Students, Parents, and Guardians:

Students who are assigned central detention and fail to attend will accrue demerits.

A student will receive central detention for being late to school or for various other school infractions. Retroactive notes will not be accepted.

If a student does not attend central detention, he/she will be assigned one demerit. If a student accumulates five or more demerits, the student will be listed as ineligible for all extracurricular activities. This includes Popcert, the senior prom, and the graduation ceremony. The student will remain ineligible until the demerits are satisfied through attending central detention, based on the equation of one central detention for one demerit.

When the demerits reach a point of zero, the student will be removed from the ineligible list. Demerits will be cumulative throughout the current school year and will be rolled over each school year. Only the principal or his/her designee will assign demerits. The ineligible list will be accessible through the attendance office.

Central detention will be held three times a day, from 7:30 am to 7:50 am, 11:30 am to 11:50 am, and again at 2:55 pm to 3:15 pm. Students have the option of attending any or all.
