At these levels book reports or projects are not assigned, yet it is hoped that the children will continue to practice and reinforce their reading skills during the summer. The recommended summer reading list has been developed with an understanding of the different reading levels and interests of the children. It is intended to serve as a guide as you help your child choose books. Rutherford Public Library has additional selections available.

Why summer reading? When the bell rings on the last day of school, children are ready to play outdoors and with their favorite toys. However, research shows that over the summer months' children will lose some of their reading skills if they do not read during this time. The following summer reading enrichment programs will encourage and reward your child for reading during the summer.
