Dear Parents and Guardians,

Travel outside the states of New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, and Delaware requires a quarantine period for those not fully vaccinated.

Thank you to those families who have informed us of your long-distance, Spring Break travel plans.

If you have not yet informed your child's school of your long-distance travel plans, it is imperative that you do so immediately. This information is needed for us to appropriately determine necessary quarantine periods in order to provide for safe learning environments in each of our buildings.

The number of families choosing travel destinations that will require a quarantine period will stress our remote learning capabilities at the elementary level. Thus, all instruction during the individually designated quarantine periods will be asynchronous. There will be no live instruction.

Assignments will be posted in Google Classroom for each grade level every day during the duration of your child's quarantine period. Completed assignments are to be submitted to your child's classroom teacher daily. Students who do not submit assignments on any given day will be marked as Absent from school. Students who will need to be in quarantine should bring all necessary learning materials home on Friday, April 16.

Please note:

Students will be marked as Absent for travel days taken before or after the district designated Spring Break week, scheduled for April 19-23. Asynchronous learning will be provided only for days that fall under your child's designated quarantine period as communicated to you via consultation with your school nurse.
